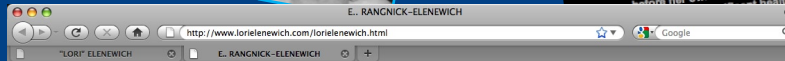
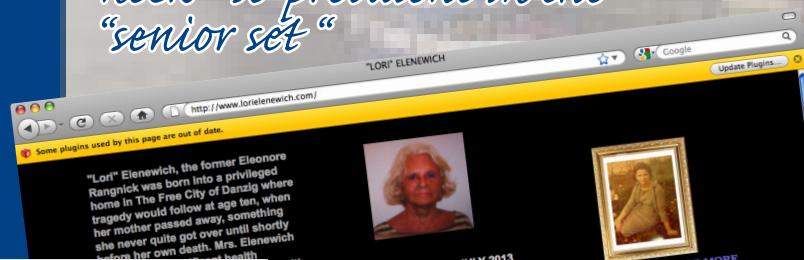
Some of the photos may be fuzzy

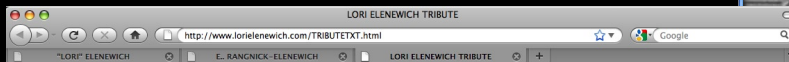
